2.1	Record	Call to Order, 6:30 PM, meeting opened.							
2.2	Record	J. Strazzulla recognized and thanked the members of the Board of Selectmen, Finance Committee, and School Committee, as well as Town Manager for attending.							
2.3	Record	J. Strazzulla and J. Seeley presented a summary of the project design, cost and schedule attached.							
2.4	Record	Joint Boards Questions:							
		<ol> <li>Will the MSBA allow the local appropriation voting to be completed beyond the 120 day period after the 6/27/18 Board Meeting?</li> <li>Yes, the MSBA will typically allow a reasonable amount of time beyond the 120 day period to accommodate recognized town meeting and election cycles.</li> </ol>							
		2. Should the project's Debt Exclusion vote be on the 11/6/18 State Election date or on a separate Special Election date?  The amount of federal and state elections, as well as several potentially controversial referendums that may be on the 11/6/18 State Election may warrant scheduling a Special Election for just the Debt Exclusion vote on the project. Further discussion needed on this topic.							
		<ol> <li>How is a Special Election date established?</li> <li>A Special Election can be established by either a citizen's petition or Board of Selectmen vote.</li> </ol>							
		4. What is the cost of a Special Election?  A Special Election costs approximately \$10,000.							
		5. Will there be any un-used funds returned to the Town from the Feasibility Study? Yes, there will be a balance, the School Building Committee will provide.							
		6. Can the Architect provide a more detailed list of the work scopes and costs associated with the Repair Only Options?  Yes, the School Building Committee will request from the Architect.							
		7. Would the MSBA approve Balmer and NES for their Accelerated Repair program if the vote failed?  The town would need to submit a statement of interest to the MSBA for them to assess for invitation into the program. The Accelerated Repair program is limited to exterior windows, boilers and roof replacement with no educational improvements.							
		8. What should be the bond term?  The merits of a 20 year or 30 year term were discussed. The Board of Selectmen will decide. Many members of each committee advocated for the 30 year term.							
		9. When does the MSBA finalize the amount of their grant?  The MSBA will finalize their grant amount at the 6/27/18 Board meeting with the approval of the Project Scope and Budget Agreement, which will then be executed between the Town and MSBA. A Project Funding Agreement will be executed once the local appropriation voting is completed.							
		<ol> <li>Does the project budget include contingencies?</li> <li>Yes, the project budget includes design and estimating contingencies and construction contingencies.</li> </ol>

		11. What is the MSBA procedure if the vote fails?  The MSBA would require the town to submit a plan to remedy the failed vote within 10 days of the failed vote. One remedy would be to go out to the voters again within a short period of time, however only minor changes would be allowed not impacting the educational program. The most likely outcome is that the town would need to start the process over again by submitting a new statement of interest.							
		12. When would the tax increase be seen on the tax bill?  The tax increase would most likely show up on the 3 <sup>rd</sup> or 4 <sup>th</sup> quarter tax bill of FY 2020.							
		13. How will the borrowing process work?  A meeting with UniBank is scheduled for 5/16/18 to discuss the process and expected interest rates for the bond. UniBank will assist the town in the bidding process for securing the bond.							
2.5	Record	A Motion was made by J. Lundquist and seconded by S. Pollock to adjourn the meeting. No discussion, motion passed unanimous.

Dear Neil:

As bond counsel to Northbridge, I can confirm that a school project borrowing can now be repaid over a term of 30 years. Where this project is to receive MSBA funds, the borrowing authority for this term is set out in M.G.L. c. 70B, §6(d), which provides as follows:

(d) Any city, town or regional school district which has received, in accordance with subsections (b) and (c), notice of approval and an estimate of the amount of a school facilities grant, may borrow from time to time to finance that portion of the cost of the approved school project not being paid by such grant, in such amount approved by the board of selectmen, mayor or city manager of the city or town, or the regional district school committee of the regional school district, and may issue bonds or notes therefor which shall bear on their face the words ?(name of city, town or regional school district) School Project Loan, chapter 70B. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan, and the loans shall be paid in not more than 25 years from their dates or up to 30 years if consistent with the guidelines established in section 7 of chapter 44. Any city, town or regional school district which has received, in accordance with subsections (b) and (c), notice of approval and an estimate of the amount of a school facilities grant may issue and renew temporary notes. The authority shall issue regulations relative to issuance of temporary notes for school construction. Indebtedness incurred under this chapter shall be outside the statutory debt limit but shall, except as herein provided, be subject to chapter 44.

Please let me know if we can provide anything further in this regard.

- 1. See attached letter previously prepared by Bond Counsel. In accordance with MGL c. 70B, sec. 6(d), 30-year borrowing is permissible, and in a town, the Board of Selectmen would make that determination after the borrowing is authorized at Town Meeting, and in this case, also following an approved Ballot Question for a Debt Exclusion at an Election.
- The Fall Town Meeting Date is determined by the Northbridge Code of Bylaws as the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in October, which this year, falls on <u>October 25, 2018</u>.

In speaking with the Town Clerk, the cost for a Special Town Meeting is estimated at \$10,000. Required expenditures include: printing 10,000 ballots, paying election workers and police officers, feeding election workers as they are unable to leave, the cost of programming the tabulation/voting machines, automark ballots for visually impaired voters, extended voter registration hours (try to use Registrars but if not hourly staff), and miscellaneous set-up expenses.

Please note that on the November State Election Ballot, the State pays for the ballots and the Town is allowed to add questions to the ballot per their approval.

3. The Town can always schedule a Special Election. MGL c. 39 requires minimum 35-days notice by the Board of Selectmen to the Town Clerk of the date of the Special Election as well as the proposed Ballot Question(s).



MSBA will fund 59.21% plus incentives of <u>eligible</u> project costs for an approved project if accepted by the voters of Northbridge.




### **FEASIBILITY STUDY PHASE SCOPE:**

  - Grades 2-4 for 510 students keep separate schools
  - Grades PK-5 for 1030 students consolidate schools and return 5<sup>th</sup> grade to Elementary setting

- Conceptual design alternatives:
  - Renovation of existing (bring up to code)
  - Renovation/addition (like-new interiors)
  - New Construction




